

TIME COMMITMENT

- SRP Volunteers must commit to serving one shift (approximately 2 hours) per week from June 3 through July 29.
- Priority for shift assignments will be given to past SRP volunteers.
- Volunteer applicants must attend Volunteer Bootcamp on Thursday, May 19 from 5:30-7:30 pm.
- In addition to their regular shifts, Volunteers also must serve a 2 hour shift during one of the following events:

Maker Pfest: June 3

End of Summer Party: July 29
- We depend on volunteers to show up on time for all scheduled shifts. Volunteers should not anticipate more than one planned absence (due to vacation, camp, etc.) over the summer.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Ability to cheerfully assist children and their caregivers.
- Ability to arrive on time/leave on time for shifts.
- Ability to communicate Summer Reading Program instructions to children and their caregivers.
- Ability to follow verbal and written instructions.
- Ability to ask questions of library staff as necessary.
- Willingness to help staff prepare program craft materials, straighten shelves and other duties.



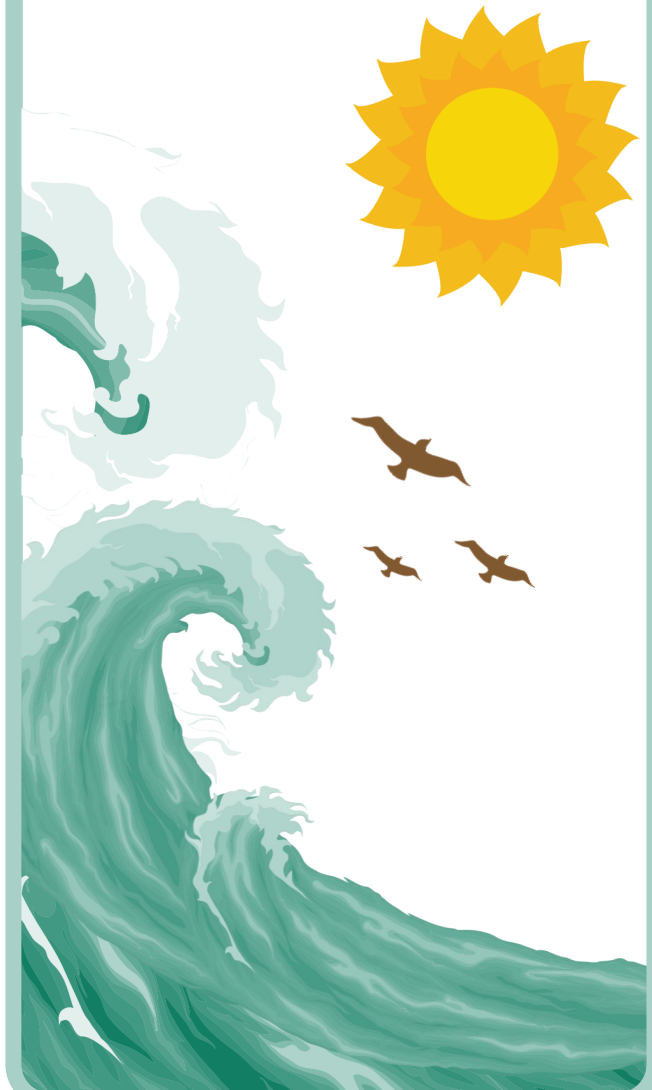

WHAT DO VOLUNTEENS DO?

SRP Volunteens primarily assist library staff with setting up, running, and cleaning up after children's programs. They also help prepare crafts, straighten the children's room, answer questions about the Summer Reading Program, and complete other tasks as needed.

Most importantly, Volunteens encourage children to have a great time at the library!

WHO CAN BE A VOLUNTEEN?

Teens ages 14-17 may apply to be a SRP Volunteer.

Applications will be available beginning Monday, April 24 and will be due on Monday, May 15. We have a limited number of SRP positions available and not everyone that applies will be selected.

In the interest of safety for the children that visit the library, all Pflugerville Public Library volunteers are required to undergo a criminal background check. The required form will be given to prospective volunteers with their application.

After the background check has cleared, Library staff will set up an in-person interview with applicants.

WHAT KIND OF PROGRAMS DO THEY HELP WITH?

Some of the programs that our volunteers help with are Story Time, Kids Club, and Tween Scene. The children at these programs can range from 3 months to 12 years old.

WHAT WE LOOK FOR IN VOLUNTEENS:

We are looking for volunteers that are friendly, mature, responsible, and punctual.

We need teens that take direction well, like working with a variety of people, and are comfortable speaking to new people.

NOT INTERESTED IN WORKING WITH CHILDREN?

We also need volunteers to help us shelve books in the summer. The deadline for summer teen shelving volunteers applications is June 15th.

Shelving volunteers also must complete a background check and interview.
